Secretary's report: accepted as read. Last years meeting notes were put into the file cabinet in the town office.

Treasurer's report: \$15,795.47 in account. Invoices and bank statements were put into the file cabinet in the town office.

#### Old Business:

- Grants update: Time to apply for carbon credit is in April. We will meet at next selectmens' meeting to present information on carbon credits available to the town
- Trails update no one present has recently hiked the trails
- River Road update: the bridge cement is spalling, but it may be possible to put I-beams and planking across to abutments so hikers, horseback riders, fire department UTV, and snowmobiles could cross the river. Phil will look into cost of steel I-beams
- Signage: \$222.00 payment has been made for Lovejoy Rd signs as an adopted road. Duck Pond and Ladyslipper trail signs are in process of being made in Tirrell's basement. Rachel will again contact Protection of NH Forest about putting signs on trails on Mt Rd. They are being us3d on a regular basis now
- Spring apple orchard pruning: Phil will contact the Sullivan County Extension Service to get a date of when they can come and demonstrate pruning old fruit trees.
- Reviewed files in file cabinet: Rachel will contact Edie to see if old minutes have been kept or stored somewhere in the office or on a computer hard drive

#### New Business:

- Inventory of tools and equipment needs to be done and given to Edie asap
- New project ideas:1.Mindy asked about looking at the property near the fire house to see if there could be a trail system developed on that 17 acres. 2. Schedule road clean up days, Second NH Turnpike is LCC's adopted road. What other roads have been adopted, and should we get signage for them?
- A date was set for Wednesday April 13th at 4:30, before black flies, to walk the boundaries on the town orchard property at Earl's Lane. We will meet there for the next meeting and walk the lines following the meeting.
- Mindy Chadwick's name will be brought to the next selectmen's meeting to ask that she be appointed to the Lempster Conservation Commission
- The planning board secretary, David Richards, gave the commission copies of proposals and plans for pits, and will see that we get copies of any future proposals and plans.
